WESTCHESTER COUNTY ARCHIVES

Individual Record Search -- \$15.00/record

If you have searched the Archives' online indexes and have found a specific record, the staff will retrieve the record and copy it for you.

Custom Search -- \$25.00/hour +\$0.50/page for copies over 10 pages

Archives staff will conduct customized research on an hourly basis on any records in the Archives' holdings. This can include genealogical research in the naturalization, marriage, court, and incorporation records not covered by the online indexes as well as research in the following indexes and their underlying records:

- Deeds, Grantor and Grantee, 1680-1907
- Mortgagor Index, 1680-1897
- Estate Records, 1782-1921
- Wills, 1775-1784 (gaps), 1787-1941

Research can also be conducted in any of the other collections held by the Archives. For information on the entire holdings of the Westchester County Archives, please see the Archives' *Guide to the Collections*, available in the Reading Room and at the Archives' website.

WESTCHESTER COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The Historical Society staff will search the Society's holdings for a fee ranging from \$40.00 to \$50.00 (depending on the records). WCHS members receive a 10% discount.

****NOTE:** Vital records themselves, such as birth and death certificates and marriage licenses, are NOT filed at the county level and are not available at the Westchester County Archives and Records Center (with the brief exception of marriage records from 1908-1936). Birth, death and marriage records are filed with the clerk of the city, town or village where the event occurred (births/deaths) or the license issued (marriages). Years covered vary by municipality. After 1881, these records were also filed with the NYS Bureau of Vital Statistics.
